PASTOR'S PEACE

This coming week for us as Christians marks another change of seasons. During the month of December we observed the four weeks of Advent, a season of preparation and new beginnings. It culminated in the arrival of Christmas, a shorter twelve day season. Now we embark on the fresh season of Epiphany which lasts eight weeks and takes us all the way to Lent.

Epiphany essentially means "revelation." Symbolized by the gleaming star over Bethlehem, the season celebrates the spread of the good news of Jesus' birth, particularly among the gentiles or non-Jews. Although we usually associate the three wise men with Christmas, based on the Gospel of Matthew, historians inform us that they probably arrived at Jesus' manger some time after his birth. That famous song "We Three Kings" was actually written as an Epiphany carol. It was intended for performance on Three Kings Day, which is always on the first Sunday on or after the start of Epiphany. Significantly, none of the three kings was ever said to be Jewish like Jesus. Instead, they were "from the East." Most likely, however, they were the first gentiles to honor Christ, who was born in the heart of the Jewish nation and thus didn't have a lot of early exposure to non-Jews.

For me Epiphany is a double reminder—first, that the light of Christ still shines even as Christmas fades from view until December 25th comes again; secondly, that the light and message of Christ aren't reserved for insiders only, but are actually meant to be shared with others, including those who may come from strange and unexpected places. Accordingly, in the season of Epiphany as the lights of Christmas fade how important it is for us to keep on coming to church where we together witness to the one whom was revealed to be our savior. Also, equally important, is our church's ongoing mission to reveal and share Christ with others, inviting and welcoming them to our church community.

I hope that we can each be a light and star on behalf of Christ for those who need him, as well as the very special community that he makes possible, perhaps without realizing or appreciating what they are presently missing out on. Be a friend. Invite a friend to church.

Begin 2019 by Joining our Exercise Classes

Are you stressed? Do you want to focus more on the being in the present? We will be having four sessions learning and practicing breathing and meditation. We will meet on Wednesday beginning January 23 from 12:30-1:30 PM for four weeks. Kathy Williams will lead the session.

Adult Shingles and TDAP Immunizations

The Shingles immunization changed in the 2017. The current recommendation is to have a two-dose series, given 6 months apart, to protect adults over 50. This is even recommended for those that have had the previous one dose shot given before 2017. This can be an expensive vaccination. To find out if your insurance covers the immunization call your **insurance company to see what your co-pay will be**. The pharmacy you choose to get the immunization at will not be able to clarify what your total co-pay will be, but your insurance company will be able clarify your cost. The TDAP vaccination is the adult version of diphtheria, tetanus (lockjaw), and pertussis (whooping cough). Years ago, the pertussis vaccine was not given to adults. It was found that adults were getting or carrying pertussis exposing other persons. It is advised to get a booster every 10 years. Often adults don't get boosters unless they are traveling out of the country or need a tetanus shot for an injury. The Hepatitis A vaccine is still recommended.
