When you sign up for Electronic Giving, you are deciding in advance to faithfully give. God always blesses that kind of faith.

2. You will simplify your life.

You won't have to remember whether you gave this month or need to send an offering by mail when you're on a trip.

Every person who gives through Electronic Giving makes our recordkeeping much easier, and more secure.

Getting Started

The Electronic Giving Process...

There are 3 steps to signing up to give through Electronic Giving. It's simple and secure: all you'll need are a few minutes to go through the process...

- 1. Go to our Church website: www.stpaulucctaylor.org—click on the "Giving" tab to access Vanco Services highly secure site.
- 2. Create your on-line profile.
- 3. Complete the on-line form and save

Frequently asked Questions

Q: How can funds be withdrawn directly from my accounts?

Only with your authorization. No one can deduct money from your account automatically without your authorization.

Q: Are electronic contributions risky?

No. An electronic contribution is safer than writing a check, and it can't be lost, stolen, or destroyed in the mail. All electronic fund transfer (EFT) transactions are governed by strict national rules and guidelines. Over four billion EFT transactions are processed annually in the United States.

Q: When would electronic contributions be taken from my account?

Funds will be taken from your account only on the date specified on your Electronic Giving Authorization Form. If any of these dates fall on a weekend, it will take effect the following Monday. The same is true of months without 30 days.

Q: If I don't write checks, how do I keep my check-book balance straight?

Your contribution is made on a pre-established date, so you can deduct it from your check record then.

Q.: What if I change banks or accounts or want to change the amount of my contribution?

You can change your giving choices at any time by going on-line to stpaulucctaylor.org/giving and login.

Q: Is there any charge to me from my bank? No. Electronic fund transfers carry no bank fees.

Q: How can I keep a record of the amount I have contributed?

Your bank statement will include an itemized list of automatic gifts given from your account. The church will continue to provide you with a personal giving statement for your tax records, or access your online giving record at stpaulucctaylor.org/giving and login.
