PASTOR'S PEACE

Lent is over. Holy Week too. But in our continuing Easter season which extends over the next month memories of Palm Sunday and Resurrection Day linger. How wonderful to see us worshiping together in larger numbers and with fuller pews than two years of COVID pandemic have often allowed. Our Easter hymn-singing was loud and resonant. So were our choir's anthems. Yet more memorable still for me were the testimonies of three young confirmands, Kaitlyn Isaacs, Dylan Stull, and Angel Staten.

After completing two years of confirmation study and many more years in Sunday School, our trinity of confirmands spoke each in turn, either on Palm Sunday or Easter Day, about what their Christian faith means to them. They also shared how our St. Paul congregation and its ministry together has positively impacted their lives, not only through classroom teaching and periodic sanctuary worship but also in personal conversations with teachers and pastors and by mission trips undertaken allowing them to put Christian faith in action. In each case also, our confirmands' families had longstanding ties to St. Paul Church and they were proud of this fact. They displayed respect for all that had been imparted to them by God, by church, by school, and by family. In times like our own which can be so crass and cynical, what a blessing to hear their youthful perspective. The thoughtful, caring, and faithful words they offered honored the Christian pulpit in which they stood.

I don't doubt that our confirmed youth are going to face big challenges on the road of life ahead. There are likely to face temptations that if not resisted could prompt them to end up despairing and cynical too. Yet if they can hold fast to the Christian faith that was in such abundant view as they shared their testimonies, life doesn't have to be dark and dismal. They will continue to experience the rewards of true faith in Jesus Christ who in life, death, and resurrection has assured us of his company, help, and blessing in life's journey, no matter how rocky the road can get. While the Christian life never comes without cost, it is never without its more than compensating joys.

I am proud of our three confirmands. Along with the confirmands' own families, we—their greater church family—should be as well. I want to thank our confirmands' families for letting us be a part of their children's lives. I also want to thank members of our church family like Pastor Cheryl Schalm, Sunday Confirmation teacher Doreen Thompson, and all the Sunday School teachers over the years for sharing their own Christian faith and wisdom with our confirmands. Kaitlyn, Dylan, and Angel are now adult members and communicants of our ministry together. May God bless them and us all as we continue to witness in faithful word and positive deeds to the saving, redeeming love of the resurrected Christ.
