MOMENT OF SHARING

Dear Congregation,

December 26, 2022

As we walk through the Twelve Days of Christmas and approach the new season of Epiphany, bringing to a close our ministry of 34 years together with our long-time Senior Pastor Geoff Drutchas, I have two important items to share with you.

The first announcement is that our congregation is in need of lay leaders to fill some remaining Council office vacancies. Although St. Paul members Jane Dykowski and Cheryl Smith have accepted nominations to serve as Council elder and deacon respectively, nominees are still needed for 2nd Vice-President, Secretary, and Trustee. All nominations are for three-year terms Everything of significance we do, we do in cooperation with others. With Rev Geoff's pending retirement, the call for lay leadership to step forward at this critical point in our ministry is beyond vital.

A Latin phrase to consider is: "Finis origine pendet" translated: "The end depends upon the beginning." How are we going to begin our future ministry together? How will we serve one another as we serve Jesus the Christ? As we transition to our future may each of us reflect on the lessons of Matthew 20:25-28 which promote lessons of servant leadership as well as:

- 1 Peter 4:10 As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace.
- Romans 14:19 So then let us pursue what makes for peace and for mutual upbuilding.
- Isaiah 6:8 Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I. Send me!"
- Hebrews 13:16 Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

Please prayerfully consider serving on the council and contact one of the Trustees if you believe the Lord is calling you to serve on the council: **MICHAEL ISAACS, FRED MILLER AND TONI HILL**.

The second announcement regards the efforts of our pastoral search.

Of the eight profiles St Paul has received, an Intentional Interim Minister has been provisioned to us by the name of Rev. George Reed who is currently serving at St John's UCC in Germantown, Ohio. According to the UCC Michigan Conference Search and Call Process the governing board of respective congregations with the help of the Michigan Conference (in our case) selects and calls Interim Ministers. Your Council has voted unanimously to appoint Rev. George Reed as St. Paul's Intentional Interim Minister. Rev. George Reed will be stepping into the pulpit as St. Paul's Intentional Interim Minister beginning Feb 5, 2023.

Rev. George Reed will remain as St. Paul's Intentional Interim Minister until this congregation votes to call a new Senior Pastor. Rev. George Reed, a former

elementary school teacher, has led an impeccable career with outstanding credentials as an Intentional Interim Minister since 2006 beginning with the Methodist Church and joining the UCC in 2012. Below is an autobiography.

George Reed, Intentional Interim Minister

Rev. Reed is from Bradford, Ohio and graduated from Wright St. University with a B.S. in Elementary Education. He taught in elementary school before being called to the ministry. He has his Master of Divinity from the United Theological Seminary in Dayton. He has also studied at the Institute of Formative Spirituality in Pittsburgh and the College of Preachers in the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C. He is a published author of various articles on sermons based on Gospel texts, lectionary worship aids, sourcebooks of worship, weddings, and funeral resources, and coauthored The Road to Hallelujah, a book of devotional activities to be used from Advent to Epiphany.

Rev. Reed was ordained as a Methodist minister serving several Methodist Churches before becoming a Certified Interim Pastor. He has since served 9 churches as an

intentional interim. After many years as a pastor, he had the calling to do intentional interim ministry. He has training in Interim Ministry Network, Calling and Caring Ministries, Neuro Linguistic Programming Master Certification, Conflict Resolution, Mediation, Advanced Clergy Clinic, Working with Anxious Congregations, Here I Stand (Using Belief Systems Charts to Change), Facilitating Healthy Pastor Congregation Relationships, Healthy Congregation Facilitator, ChurchSmart, Systems Theory with Special Application to Congregational Life, and more.

While Rev. George Reed serves as our Intentional Interim Minister, The Search Team will continue the discernment process for a new Senior Pastor. The United Church of Christ has truly come through for our congregation in providing us with an Intentional Interim Minister of the caliber we find in Rev. George Reed. This takes pressure off the Search Team and I hope relieves anxiety for each of you as members of our congregation.

With an Intentional Interim Minister in place, St. Paul becomes attractive for pastoral candidates who will know they will not be following in the immediate footsteps of a long-tenured pastor, but that of an Intentional Interim Minister. UCC history has shown that pastors who immediately follow a long-tenured pastor, without an interim pastor in-between, all too often end up becoming a short-tenured pastor.

In closing, please consider serving a role on the council in support of our Intentional Interim Minister Rev. George Reed who is very excited to lead us in worship at St Paul. Our Council and Congregation will need to help Rev. George Reed as he aids us. Serving on Council gives you the chance to do both.

Epiphany Season Start Celebrated with Communion Sacrament

The new season of Epiphany will be celebrated with the communion sacrament on Sunday, January 8th. Officially beginning with Three Kings' Day, January 6th, Epiphany extends for six weeks following the Twelve Days of Christmas. It is symbolized by the Bethlehem star which the Wise Men-Kings followed to reach Jesus' manger side.

Those arriving for sanctuary worship on the first Sunday of Epiphany morning will receive individualized, sealed communion wafers and juice cup from the elders and ushers greeting them in the narthex. These communion "kits" can be opened at the time of the sacrament. However, you may want to partly peel back the seals in advance readiness.

Those joining worship at home via Facebook live streaming are encouraged to make use of bread or cracker with grape juice from their own kitchen supplies. All communion elements, whether in church or home, will be consecrated by Pastor Schalm as part of communion prayers.

At St. Paul Church we observe an open communion which means that participants do not need to be formal members of the congregation to share in the sacred meal. Instead, what is simply asked is that we be baptized Christians of adult age who seek to walk more closely with Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. All participants, whether at home or church, are called to share in this time with a spirit of profound reverence.

Annual Congregational Meeting Set For Third January Sunday

The annual meeting of the congregation will be held on Sunday, January 15th, immediately following the 10 a.m. service. Outgoing President David Lange and President elect Aaron Johnson will preside at the annual meeting with presentations by the Treasurer.

Upon arriving on Sunday morning January 15th for both the worship and meeting, St. Paul members are asked to sign in at the narthex table to help establish a quorum. Everyone's participation counts. A printed copy of our church's annual report, which will be referenced throughout the meeting will be available for pick-up. A deacon will be on hand to answer any questions you may have about sign-in, morning worship, or the meeting.

At the beginning of the service the annual meeting will be called to order to establish the council members attending and to establish a quorum. Once that is completed the meeting will be suspended until the service concludes. When the meeting is re-established, minutes of the semi-annual meeting will be approved, end-of-year reports from Church Council members (elders, deacons, and trustees)

and various committees and organizations of our congregation will be shared. A presentation of the financial report for 2022 will be followed by a proposal and approval for a 2023 unified budget. Also, a slate of candidates for the Church Council will be presented by the trustees for a vote of the congregation to fulfill positions of elder, deacon, secretary, trustee and second vice president.

Please plan on attending this very important meeting of the congregation.
