#### **FROM THE PASTOR**



Greetings:

I want to share with you some things about *Interim Ministry* because it has been many years since St. Paul UCC has had one. I hope this will help clarify my role here and help us be more faithful to the task that is before us.

First there is the descriptive title of who I am and what I do no matter where I serve which is 'intentional interim pastor'. This signifies that I do not serve a congregation as long term supply pastor but I come to serve during the 'interim' or transitional time with a congregation and I do this with 'intention', that is I come to assist the congregation with their specific tasks. I am here to help you come to terms with your history. This does not mean that your past is a problem but that your past holds meaning not only for times gone by but to help you discern where God is calling you in the present and into the future. Which leads us into the task of defining more clearly who we are as a congregation and what gifts/talents/issues we have to work with. Then we can begin to more clearly discern the future that lies before us. We will learn together to celebrate the past and the things that will remain the same and to anticipate and enter fully into the new things that God has for us.

Secondly, I am here as your 'Interim Senior Pastor'. I do not come to replace Reverend Drutchas but I have come to take over the position which he filled during the transitional time until your settled pastor is called. Often people ask what I do as an interim pastor and the answer is: everything I would do (and did for many years) if I were a settled pastor plus the additional work of guiding the congregation through the transition from one settled pastor to the next.

Call on me as you would any pastor who serves your congregation and feel free to call on me with questions about the transition time. I look forward to serving among you in our time together.

"For if you remain silent at this time, relief and deliverance for the Jews will arise from another place, but you and your father's family will perish. And who knows but that you have come to your royal position for such a time as this?"

#### ~Esther 4:14

The Bible is full of countless examples of people - average people just like you and I, whom God chose to do big things for His kingdom through. There was Moses who led the Israelites out of Egypt, Jonah who warned the people of Nineveh, and Esther who risked her life for her people. And then there are those who followed their example: Martin Luther who led a reform, Abe Lincoln who took a stand on slavery, Martin Luther King Jr. who spoke against racism, Mother Teresa who served the poorest of the poor in Calcutta, Rev. Faith Fowler who continues to serve the poor and homeless in the Cass corridor of Detroit and the list goes on and on. Through scripture and other genres we know that many of these people doubted themselves and felt unqualified to do what they were asked to do - even to the point of pleading with God to choose someone else!

Like Queen Esther, who concealed her Jewish identity to the King until such time he made a royal decree that would annihilate her people, you may find yourself in a seemingly impossible or troubling situation. What do we do when in such a situation? Do we speak up like Esther or remain silent? Do we try to blend in and fit in or do we stand out? Do we cower in fear or proceed with courage? Esther chose to courageously speak up and stand out. As a result, God used her to save the nation. "It's not hyperbole to say that her courage changed the course of history. Nor is it an overstatement to say that God can do the same with us."-Max Lucado

Like Esther, we can act in a way that will bless more people than we can imagine. During the season of Lent, let us meditate upon God's Word and let us, with courage, speak out and stand up and join God in His work.

#### Michigan Conference Minister to lead us in Worship on March 5th

On March 5, St Paul UCC Taylor will have the pleasure of hosting our new Michigan Conference Minister, Rev. Dr. Lillian Daniel to lead us in worship. She began her position with the Michigan Conference UCC on July 1st, 2022. Rev. Dr. Lillian Daniel served as Senior Pastor at First Congregational Church in Dubuque, Iowa (2016-2022) - a church with a heart for the city located in historic downtown Dubuque. Our own youth groups led by Pastor Cheryl Schalm have visited Dubuque, Iowa for mission trips in previous years. Prior to Lillian's arrival in Iowa, she spent ten years as Senior Pastor of a 1,400- member church located in a western Chicago suburb. Graduating from Bryn Mawr College, she earned her Masters and Doctorate from Yale Divinity School and Hartford Seminary. Lillian began her ministry in Cheshire, Connecticut as an Associate Pastor and three years later became Senior Pastor at the Church of the Redeemer in New Haven. Rev. Dr. Lillian Daniel is traveling across the state of Michigan with her goal to visit all the UCC Michigan congregations by year's end 2023. Rev. Dr. Lillian Daniel comes from Iowa and is an accomplished preacher, teacher, and writer having spoken at over 140 churches including, but not limited to the National Cathedral, Duke Chapel, King's College, London and Queen's College, Ontario. She has taught preaching at a number of schools, including Chicago Theological Seminary, University of Chicago, University of Dubuque Theological Seminary and Yale Divinity School. Rev. Dr. Lillian Daniel has been featured in the New York Times and on PBS Television with her writing described as "biting, hilarious, pitch perfect, tender, and often stunningly beautiful."
