## **Church Safety and Security - Emergency Response Team Members**

Ensuring the safety of our membership is one of the most important goals of the Safety and Security Ministry. The ministry is looking for interested people who would like to serve on the Emergency Response Team (ERT) for the Church, currently there are 11 people who have volunteered to be on the team, we are looking for about 20-25 people to serve on this important ministry. Roles and responsibilities of an ERT member include: Building evacuations (fire, tornados, electrical outages, etc.), attending semi-annual training, being familiar with all aspects of the buildings, evaluate and eliminate all safety hazards in the building and attend quarterly meetings. If you are interested in serving on the St. Paul Emergency Response Team, please contact Dan Case or any member of the Safety and Security Ministry.

#### Parsonage gets a Renovation

It took several weeks and a lot of manpower to complete the task of getting the parsonage ready for our interim Pastor to move in and for the future Senior Pastor and their family.

Here are just some of the tasks completed. Walls were washed and painted on the first and second floor. In the basement the walls had to be scrapped of the old paint and then it was repainted with Dry-lock paint. The old carpeting was removed and replaced in the living room, dining room, den, breezeway and one bedroom. The fover off the west side received new tile flooring as well as the landing and stairs into the main floor and the stairs and landing going up to the second floor. Thirteen light fixtures were replaced, as well as guite a few electrical outlets and some of the light switches. Both bathrooms had new sinks, faucets and cabinets purchased and installed. In the main bathroom a handicap handrail was installed, shower head repaired and caulked along with caulking around the bathtub faucet and spout. Installed new curtains, curtain rods and blinds that were donated. In the kitchen a new stove was purchased and installed, a new cabinet was installed that was made and donated by two of our members to fill the space created because the new stove is smaller. A dishwasher was donated that was cleaned and made sure to be in good running condition. All the cupboards throughout the house were cleaned. Sump pump had to be replaced in the basement. A complete list of what was done can be found on the bulletin board in the fellowship hall. Funding for the parsonage is coming from the remaining PPP money the Church received during COVID.

## **Pastors Office is Getting a New Look**

Once the parsonage was complete it was time to move on to the pastor's office. Wallpaper was stripped off the walls, ceiling was removed (it was falling in), carpeting removed and the closet was dismantled. Once the removal was complete the task of the new renovation began. The walls were washed to remove the wallpaper paste, then all of the walls had to be repaired of cracks and holes. One wall had some major repairs because there had been a leak in the upstairs bathroom and it caused damage that was not visible because of the wallpaper. The west wall needed to be insulated and new drywall installed. Once the walls were repaired and sanded they received a coat of primer and then the finish coat

of paint was done. In the bathroom the old sink and faucet was removed and a new one installed with all new plumbing. The walls and ceiling were painted and a new tile floor was installed. A new light fixture was also installed. The next task that is currently being done is the installation of a new ceiling. Once that is complete it will be time to install underlayment and new carpeting. Funding for the Office renovation is being paid for by a Memorial Donation from Arlene and Frank Wolfram, a plague will be placed on the wall in the office as a Memorial.
