Dear Friends,

As most of you know, I was ordained in The United Methodist Church. What you may not know is that after the Bishop lays hands and ordains us, we are then given a very special gift: a crystal ball. This is very handy in working with congregations as it allows pastors to discern all the needs and wants of the congregation. We just consult our crystal

balls and instantly we know who is in the hospital, who is sick, who wants a visit, who has a question about what we do. It is really a very helpful tool for a pastor to have. Unfortunately, with all the moves that United Methodist clergy go through over the years, many of us end up with a broken crystal ball and there are no replacements offered.

I, alas, find myself in the situation that my crystal ball was shattered during one of my moves and I can no longer rely on it to guide me. I, instead, have to resort to depending on parishioners to talk to me. If you are in the hospital I no longer can know this without someone telling me. If you have a question I cannot give you the answer unless you ask me. If there is something you need from me you will have to tell me what that is.

So if you have questions, concerns, wants, or needs that you want me to address you will have to let me know. Without my crystal ball I cannot know these things just because you talked to someone else about them. Telling the cashier at the grocery or the person who does your hair or the person who picks up your trash or the person beside you in the pew will not do us any good. We are going to have to depend on the old fashioned method of talking to each other instead.
