Michael J. Fox of "Family Ties" and "Back to the Future" fame took an interesting perspective from his ongoing journey with Parkinson's. In a recent interview with Sunday Morning anchor Jane Pauley, Fox challenged the audience with a powerful concept that with gratitude optimism is sustainable. All that is needed for gratitude is to find something to be grateful for and then we can find something to look forward to and carry on. Some people have gratitude jars where they write what they are grateful for on a piece of paper and read it later. Perhaps more of us should be writing down what we are grateful for, including myself. Gratitude refers to the ability to show thanks for the things you have and the things you are grateful for. It helps you get closer to the LORD by recognizing all the blessings in your life and makes it easier to focus on the positive.

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Breaking down Paul's instruction in the 1st Thessalonians passage shown, we are instructed to "Rejoice always". Joy in Paul's letters to the churches is an attribute of the Christian life as taught in Romans 14:17. For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking but of righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit. Equally, the joy that we are to cherish is the fruit of the Holy Spirit as found in Galatians 5:22. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness...

Joy is often associated with the firm hope of the Christian who is sealed by the Holy Spirit. Romans 5:2-5, 12:12 tells us: Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.... Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. Reinhold Niebuhr's Serenity Prayer reminds us that accepting hardship is a pathway to peace. mean to be sealed by the Holy Spirit? A reading from Ephesians 1:13 says: him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, and to further understand the joy we should have being sealed in the Holy Spirit Paul writes in Ephesians 4:30 And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. You are sealed for the day of redemption! That is what being sealed means. That is a faithful reason to be grateful. Paul continues with his call to us to "pray continually" suggesting a prayerful state of mind, an unbreakable fellowship with God, and a volitional consciousness of being in the presence of Jesus the Christ throughout our days. Christians are to be marked by thanksgiving and gratefulness for the free grace we have in the salvation of our Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ.

Colossians 3:15 And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful.

In the ongoing transitions in the life of St Paul UCC we have seen many new changes for which we have an opportunity to be grateful:

- · Interim Minister Rev Reed is leading our congregation
- Beverly M Glenn as our new organist.
- Sound lay leadership serving on Council and on our Search Team



The up and down cut paths in an uncut key are completely open to us. In the ups and downs in our walk of faith we can determine what doors we can unlock for our future ministry. Our Savior Jesus cut his own path in giving us the key to salvation when he went to Calvary's Cross and gave thanks for the opportunity to be our atoning sacrifice fulfilling the prophecy of Isaiah 53:5 But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed.

As we look to celebrate graduations and Father's Day, the following devotion written by a parent of a graduate truly struck me. I hope it strikes a cord with you too and serves as a reminder that every human being has value, a purpose, and a part in God's Almighty plan.

"Today has been a special day, dear Lord. Sunlit hours that we'll remember always. For we've rejoiced together as a family that we have reached the stage in life when all our children have finally completed their education. Today we watched our youngest daughter process in solemn convocation, and then applauded as she was given her degree.

Thank you, Lord for all the fun we've had along the way. That we have learned so much through teaching them. And that we have been able to celebrate with them each little lesson learned and hard-won honor, knowing that one day they'll stride into the future, equipped and ready to face the challenges of adult life.

But Lord, I think the moment I'll remember with greatest clarity, as I look back upon the high points of the day, was when another mother grasped my hand and said, her face alight with pride, "Please let me introduce you to my son."

And as I looked for someone wearing cap and gown, or at the very least a young man who could tease his sister about the things she had achieved, I realized she was leading me toward a wheelchair, and a young man, whom superficially it seems is most unlikely to ever do the basic things that independent living would demand.

I was so challenged, Lord, because she had such joy in him. There was no sense that this young man was any less a person than all the laughing throng of able-bodied youngsters gathered around him, or that he should be, in any way, considered second best.

As well as being challenged, Lord, I was humbled. If it were me, would I be able to take joy in such a child, facing the future with serenity and courage as this brave woman does? Or would I fear, wondering how we'd cope with growing older?

And in the secret places of my heart, would I be harboring both anger and resentment at what you had permitted, Lord, or pitying myself and mourning the lack of future independence for both of us?

Thank you that we can rejoice about the things our children have achieved. But please forgive us if we have given them the false impression that academic honors, sporting prowess, or even a glittering career is all we care about.

For Your Word tells us that though it's good to use the gifts with which you have entrusted us, it's not the yardstick for success in your economy, for there is more to life than this.

Please help that mother and father Lord. Help all the parents of such challenged children, whatever those challenges might be. And help the children to live their lives with pride and confidence in who they are.

Then please enable all of us to see them through your eyes, for truly we're all equal in your sight, and every one of us is infinitely precious, totally loved, and absolutely valuable to you."

May we work to see within each human being what God sees! Congratulations to all the graduates and a Blessed and Happy Father's Day to all the dads and men who have served as such.
