Possibly, they don't have the proper clothing to wear. Occasionally, I have heard of individuals who say they don't have an offering to put in the collection plate so they are embarrassed to attend. For some they are busy, out of town and traveling. Others are ill or living with health concerns that keep them from leaving their homes.

I think of reasons for not attending church, I equally think of reasons to attend. What about you? What do you expect when you think of church? It is easy to think of a building, but that cannot be enough. The church is a collection of individuals with shared common interests. As a Christian church, we are a group of individuals who seek to know and follow Jesus the Christ.

We work at knowing the teachings of Jesus as we serve as his disciples, living, teaching and loving as he did. As Christians, we follow in his ways in our actions and practices on a day-to-day basis. It isn't always easy; we don't always succeed. We know however, that as the beloved Children of God, we always have the opportunity for a new beginning.

We have never been told that discipleship would be easy, we know that we will never complete the work that is needed. Still, the work that has been started is ours to continue. May COMMUNITY OUTREACH OPPORTUNITY

In honor of the youth, past and present, who annually did a 30 hour famine to benefit World Vision, we will be collecting monetary gifts on their behalf during the month of May. World Vision International is an ecumenical Christian humanitarian aid, development, and advocacy organization. It provides emergency and advocacy work for those living in poverty and struck with natural disasters and war. They report the following:

- **Food insecurity is growing:** Over 258 million people across 58 countries face crisis or higher levels of food insecurity, according to the World Food Program (WFP).
- The war in Ukraine, Israel and Gaza are impacting global hunger: Even before the war began, food insecurity was rising worldwide.
- Food insecurity forces families into distressing choices: When families don't have enough to eat or money to buy food, they must often make difficult and dangerous decisions that impact their children's well-being and put them at risk of violence.
- **Millions of children are dangerously malnourished:** 30 million children are suffering from wasting (also known as acute malnutrition).

In addition to collecting funds, we will be collecting non-perishable food items for Fish & Loaves, our local food pantry. All checks can be made out to St. Paul United Church of Christ and marked World Vision on the memo line. One check will then be sent to World Vision in June. Food donations can be dropped in the box located in the Narthex.

GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

2025 Budget Status - Thank You for your Continued Support

I will continue to report only our actual income and expenses for the remainder of 2025. Our actual income for March was \$21,010.19 and our actual expenses for March were \$13,985.53, a difference of \$7,024.66 which is a positive balance for the month. We are currently \$3,820.34 positive for the year. Our General Fund, which is the fund we use to pay our expenses (salaries, utilities, etc) is at \$37,988 an increase of \$6,525 from February. Qualified Charitable Distribution

St. Paul members have been asking about Qualified Charitable Distributions and if St. Paul qualifies. The answer is **YES**, the Secure 2.0 Act of 2022 changed the age for Minimum Required Distributions from 72 to 73 years of age, however it had no impact on Qualified Charitable Distributions. QCD is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity, St. Paul does qualify. QCDs can be counted toward satisfying your minimum required distributions (MRDs) for the year. Since it is already excluded from your taxable income, you can't take the itemized deduction (charitable donation) again. That would be double-dipping. While many IRAs are eligible for QCDs—there are requirements:

- You must be 70½ or older to be eligible to make a QCD.
- The maximum annual amount that can qualify for a QCD is \$100,000. This applies to the sum of QCDs made to one or more charities in a calendar year.
- For a QCD to count towards your current year's MRD, the funds must come out of your IRA, generally by December 31.
