INTERIM SENIOR PASTOR

I've been busy lately. Busier than usual it seems. You know how it is. Hours and days are filled with things I choose to do, activities I enjoy with family and friends, working at St. Paul, volunteering as a character in the Underground Railroad reenactment and more. I enjoy the outdoor yard work. I at least try at a garden. There are things that have to be done, laundry, grocery shopping and bills to be paid.

I get busy and easily overlook time for personal meditation, prayer and reflection. Not taking this time reflects in my attitude and actions throughout the day. These quiet times are important times for each of us and they can easily be overlooked. One way I like to ensure a bit of personal time is to follow the UCC Daily Devotional on the internet. Written by a variety of people they offer a spiritual reflection worthy of time, consideration and prayer.

Here is a devotional written in March of this year by UCC Pastor Donna Schaper.

For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." - Galatians 5:14 (NRSV)

Chapter 5 of Galatians is worth a good long read. It is about the subject of Christian freedom, which the writer imagines is a kind of slavery to love. It is about the difference between the law and grace, using circumcision as an example, concluding that it matters little if we are or are not circumcised. Instead it matters a lot how we talk about the subject to each other.

Maybe you don't need to read this chapter. You may have no issues about right and wrong cultural customs, the right way to dress for church, the right foods to eat in Lent. You may never have spoken of chocolate cake as "sinful" or scoffed at someone who was obese. You may attend church meetings and tolerate all the points of view expressed by other members. If so, skip this chapter.

If, however, you find yourself coiled culturally, intolerant of difference, unkind when someone smokes in public or brings a dog to a meeting, turn to Galatians 5 and sit down for the long read. You will learn what it means to be in love with each other. You will also be brought to attention by the warning that sometimes when we "bite and devour each other," we actually find ourselves chewed up, even consumed.

Be Kind. Fall in love. Think less about circumcision, ancient or modern, and more about love.

2025 Budget Status - Thank You for your Continued Support

I will continue to report only our actual income and expenses for the remainder of 2025. Our actual income for April was \$13,975.00 and our actual expenses for March were \$14,876.75, a difference of \$901.75 which is a negative balance for the month. We are still currently \$2,854.72 positive for the year. Our General Fund, which is the fund we use to pay our expenses (salaries, utilities, etc) is at \$36,532.81 a decrease of \$1,401.75 from March.
