HOW CAN I HELP AT ST. PAUL

"There are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit gives them. There are different ways of serving but the same Lord is served There are different abilities to perform service, but the same God gives ability to all for their particular service. The Spirit's presence is shown in some way in each person for the good of all."

- Corinthians 12:4-7

When men and women feel a genuine sense of belonging to the body of Christ, they inevitably hear Christ calling them to care, share, and help. There are many ways in which members can make a difference in the life of our congregation. But there are several opportunities that especially stand out as we worship together and sustain a variety of ministries. Please consider these:

Acolyte — The position of acolyte is one of the oldest in the Christian churches. He or she has responsibility for lighting and extinguishing the chancel candles at the start and finish of our worship services. Please speak with the senior deacon, Jeannette Wackro, about your interest.

Lector — On Sunday mornings and at other worship services, volunteers read the scripture lessons aloud to the congregation from the lectern at the front of the church. If you are interested in volunteering to become a lector, please speak with Rev Anderson.

Bell Ringer — The present bell in our church belfry has rung for services at St. Paul United Church of Christ since 1911. Bell ringers are needed for the daytime and evening services held during the week. Bell ringing is not difficult, and training is provided. Please speak with the senior deacon, Jeannette Wackro, about your interest.

Usher — Prior to every worship service, members of the congregation join Council representatives in greeting and ushering worshipers. Afterwards, the ushers also assist in straightening up the sanctuary so that it is ready for the next service. The shared camaraderie is great. If you are interested in serving as an usher, please speak with the presiding deacon.

Choir Member — Our church has Chancel Choir, which provides music for Sunday morning worship and other occasions. Choir volunteers are warmly welcomed. No auditions necessary. Training is provided. Please speak with the Music Director, Ava Janus, about your interest.

Sound System Technician — Our church has a sound system which is used during worship. Controls for the sound system are located in a cabinet in the sanctuary balcony. Sound system operational training is available. The position pays \$20 per service. If you would like to volunteer as a sound tech, please speak with a member of the IT Ministry.

Facebook Live Technician - Our Church broadcasts our Sunday Services utilizing Facebook Live each week. The church is equipped with a computer, three cameras, two monitors, a switchboard, and other video equipment located in our balcony. Training will be provided. No technical skills are required. The position pays \$20 per service. If you would like to volunteer as a Facebook Live Tech, please speak with a member of the IT Ministry.

Host Coffee Hour - Every Sunday after the Worship Service we host a coffee hour. The host would be responsible for ordering and picking up the donuts, usually about three dozen, serving people and cleaning up after Coffee Hour. The coffee, juice, creamers, etc are provided by the Church. Training will be provided. If interested in volunteering, please call the Church Office at (313) 291-1221.

Christian Education Teacher — Our congregation has a strong and positive educational ministry for children and youth. Each year, teachers and other classroom volunteers are needed for Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, and the Summer Sunday program. Training and guidance is provided. If interested in volunteering, please speak with the Chairperson of Christian Education or the Sunday School Superintendent — Debbie Case, Candace Poet or Katilyn Isaacs.

Merry Mailer — Every month a group of volunteers gathers to help collate and prepare for mailing our monthly church newsletter, The Tidings. The collation work is not difficult: the more hands the merrier. If you are interested in joining the Merry Mailers on the fourth Monday of every month, please speak with the office administrative assistant, Cindy Romas.

Office Helper — Our church office, which is so central to the wider ministry of our congregation, publishes a monthly newsletter, plus a weekly morning bulletin, to keep members updated and informed. In any given week, one or two church mailings are also prepared and mailed out. Additional help is always needed and appreciated to help ensure that the important work of our church office gets done. I am continuing to report only our actual income and expenses for the remainder of 2025. Our actual income for July was \$12,501.00 and our actual expenses for July were \$20,113.62 , a difference of \$7,612.62 which is a negative balance for the month. We are currently \$13,449.28 negative for the year. Our General Fund, which is the fund we use to pay our expenses (salaries, utilities, etc) is at \$18,728.81 a decrease of \$8,112.62 from June. Rummage Sale Alert! What you can Donate

This year, the Fall Rummage Sale will take on a new format, as we will not be setting up the garage or the tent on the East side of the Church. In light of this change, we will only be accepting specific items for the sale. To assist you in this process, we have attached a comprehensive list detailing the acceptable items as well as those that we can no longer accept. While this list is not exhaustive, it serves as a helpful guideline to ensure a smooth and successful event. We appreciate your understanding and collaboration as we adapt to these changes.

Acceptable items:

Clothing, shoes, purses, toys, small appliances (can opener, rosters, toaster ovens, etc.), fine china, dinnerware, pots/pans, small electronic items (irons, alarm clocks, calculators, etc.), drapes, DVD, VHS movies, records, books, jewelry, pictures, bedding, decorations (Xmas, Easter, etc.), office supplies, basically any interior item.

Non-Acceptable items:

TV's, monitors, computers, DVD player, VHS players, lamps, tools, outside furniture, inside furniture (tables, couches, chairs, dressers, bed sets, etc.), plumbing items, electrical items, outside equipment (lawn mower, edger, shovel, etc.), luggage, bikes, large outside toys, yard decorations, basically any outside items, large electronic items, or building supplies.

We sincerely apologize for any inconvenience this decision may cause and want to express our deep appreciation for the unwavering support and enthusiasm you have shown for our Rummage Sales in the past. It is with a heavy heart that we announce the discontinuation of the outside portion of the Rummage Sales, a decision made necessary by a shortage of volunteers.
