A Spirit-Filled Gathering at St. Paul: Welcoming Rev Lesa Branham

On a weekend marked by challenging weather, the faithful members and friends of St. Paul demonstrated true devotion and unity, coming together in the warmth of Christian fellowship to welcome Rev. Lesa Branham, a candidate for Senior Pastor. The Search Committee, guided by prayer and discernment, hosted a "Meet and Greet" on Saturday, January 24th. Despite sub-zero temperatures, both current and former members braved the cold, drawn by the hope and excitement of new spiritual leadership. The gathering was filled with joyful reminiscing, laughter, and the unmistakable presence of the Holy Spirit, as hearts reconnected and bonds were strengthened. Many lingered for the full two hours, savoring the blessing of community.

On Sunday, the congregation's commitment shone even brighter. Through snowfall and difficult roads, over 70 people attended in person, while 38 families joined in worship via Facebook Live. The sanctuary was filled with praise, gratitude, and anticipation as Rev Branham led the candidate service. It was a truly joyous occasion, a testament to God's faithfulness and the enduring spirit of St. Paul's family.

After the service, Rev Branham was introduced once more, then prayerfully escorted to the West Room as the congregation gathered for a Special Congregational Meeting. Guided by the Holy Spirit, the members engaged in thoughtful discussion before voting. With a resounding **99.7% YES** vote, the church extended an official offer to Rev Branham to accept the Calling as Senior Pastor. Now, as we await Rev Branham's prayerful decision over the next two to four weeks, we lift our voices in prayer, trusting that God's will shall be done.

May the Lord bless Rev Branham with wisdom and peace, and may St. Paul continue to be a beacon of faith, hope, and love in our community. Let us pray together for guidance, unity, and the joyful future that God has prepared for us all

Lenten Season Start Observed with Ash Wednesday Service

Lenten season at St. Paul United Church will begin with a service on Ash Wednesday, February 18th, 7:00 p.m. For the Ash Wednesday Service, Pastor Linda Anderson will be administering ashes prepared from the burning of palms from last year's Holy Week observance. Church members and friends will be singly invited to come forth to receive the ashes at the foot of the chancel steps during the service.

Congregational Meeting Approves Unified Budget and elects New Council Members

Our St. Paul congregation held its annual meeting immediately following the Sunday morning service on January 18th. Reports from 2025 were presented either orally or in written form. Also included in the meeting booklet available for pick-up in the narthex was a printed 2025 financial report, showing a deficit for the year, plus the proposed unified budget for 2026. Both the 2025 financial report and the unified budget proposal for 2026 were accepted through motion and a vote of the congregation's quorum. Salary increases for staff were included in the approved 2026 budget.

As further points of business for the meeting, a proposed bylaw revision changing the terms of office for Council members and eligibility changes for treasurer, trustee and recording secretary. The final bylaw revisions will be voted on at the regularly scheduled semi-annual meeting in July 2026.

Another important part of the congregational meeting was the election of new Council members. Approved for a one year term were Toni Hill (trustee); Dan Case (treasurer) and Tim Ruffner (president). Those approved for a three year term were Pam Lange (elder) and Jane Dykowski (recording secretary).

February is American Heart Month: Take Charge of Your Heart Health

According to the CDC, heart disease is the leading cause of death for men, women, and people of most racial and ethnic groups. In 2025, 681,000 people died from heart disease, which is the equivalent of 1 in every 5 deaths. This February, during American Heart Month, we emphasize the importance of heart health and encourage everyone to take proactive steps to reduce their risk.

Risk Factors of CVD

Several factors increase the risk of developing heart disease:

- High Cholesterol: Elevated levels can lead to plaque buildup in arteries.
- Smoking: Significantly raises the risk of heart disease.
- Obesity: Excess weight contributes to heart disease.
- Physical Inactivity: Lack of exercise is detrimental to heart health.

Take Action: Steps to a Healthier Heart

- Manage Stress: Practice relaxation techniques such as meditation or yoga.
- Know Your Numbers: Regularly check your blood pressure, cholesterol, and blood sugar levels.
- Adopt a Heart-Healthy Diet: Incorporate fruits, vegetables, whole grains, and lean proteins into your meals.
- Engage in Regular Physical Activity: Aim for at least 150 minutes of moderate-intensity aerobic exercise per week.
- Quit Smoking: Seek resources to help you stop smoking.
- Limit Alcohol Consumption: Drink in moderation.

The **Deacons** serve to maintain order and good behavior at all services of worship of the Congregation and other meetings of the Church. They are responsible for ensuring that our sanctuary is ready and equipped for worship.

1. COUNCIL / CABINET

- a. Attend monthly Council meetings, as scheduled.
- b. Attend special Council meetings, as scheduled.
- c. Attend quarterly Cabinet meetings, as scheduled. (Senior Deacon only)
- d. Attend yearly Council Retreat.
- e. Work Coffee Hour or special events when Council has volunteered to host.
- f. The Senior Deacon shall provide a written report including attendance records for each Council meeting.
- g. Attend the Semi-Annual and Annual meetings.
- h. Prepare a report for the Annual Meeting.

2. CHURCH SERVICES

- a. Responsible to provide a schedule of greeters, ushers and acolytes for all Church services, or appoint and supervise an Usher/Greeter/Acolyte Coordinator.
 1. Provide training and supervision for ushers, greeters and acolytes.
- b. Responsible for ringing of the church bell during all Church services and to train and maintain an up-to-date list of members who have volunteered to ring the bell. (Funerals are handled by the Sexton)
- c. Responsible for receiving the offering at all Church Services and ensuring their safekeeping by bagging and dropping into the Office safe.
- d. Reserve pews in the Sanctuary, when requested.
- e. Verify hymn boards are correct per the bulletin.
- f. Verify that flowers / rose are on the altar / pulpit.
- g. Unlock and lock Church doors prior to and after all services.
- h. Verify that the heat or air-conditioning are on prior to worship services.
- i. Maintain attendance records for all Church services.
- j. Ensure Sanctuary, Narthex and Usher's room are cleaned after each Church service.
- k. Replace pads / pencils in attendance books, as required.

3. SPECIAL

- a. Responsible for training and to maintain an up-to-date list of Auxiliary Deacons who have been approved by the St. Paul Council.
- b. One Deacon shall serve on the Worship Ministry.
