2026 Budget Status - Thank You for your Continued Support

Dear friends in Christ, I want to share an update on our May finances with gratitude and transparency. As always, I am reporting only our actual income and expenses. For the month of May, our actual income totaled \$12,590, while our expenses were \$21,603, resulting in a net difference of negative \$9,013. Through the first five months of the year, we continue to carry a negative balance. Our General Fund, which supports the day-to-day ministry and operations of St. Paul—including salaries, utilities, and other essential expenses—currently stands at \$4,681. This is a decrease of \$9,513 from April.

Even in seasons when the numbers are challenging, we trust in God’s continued faithfulness and provision for His church. Thank you for the generosity, care, and faithful stewardship you show through your giving. Your gifts help sustain the mission and ministry of St. Paul, and they are a true blessing to our congregation and community. "On a very stormy day, December 1st, 1946 our Tower and Public Address system was dedicated in the memory of the boys who gave their all for their country and as a tribute to the boys and girls who served and are serving today. Every available seat was taken and several extra chairs used. We are glad to see the interest which was shown not only on that day but also since the time we began receiving offerings for this cause. Our offerings that day amounted to \$81.50 which helped to pay all the bills and left a small amount in the treasury. To all who cooperated we say a hearty "Thank You" We have heard many comments about our tower public address system and hope to continue to enjoy it in the future."
